Such multimodal involvement boosts understanding and critical thinking (Gilakjani & Sabouri, 2016).

Mobile applications like Duolingo, EWA, BBC Learning English App, and Elsa Speak have revolutionized independent listening practice. These apps allow learners to practice anytime and anywhere, offering personalized exercises and instant feedback.

Teachers can assign app-based listening tasks as homework, enabling continuous learning outside the classroom. This blended approach—combining in-class and digital learning—has proven to increase motivation and consistency among learners (Vandergrift, 2004).

## 4. The Role of Authentic Materials

Authentic resources, including as movie snippets, radio shows, news broadcasts, and interviews, are essential for helping students grasp natural language. Exposure to actual speech helps pupils become used to different accents, idiomatic idioms, and cultural allusions. For example, brief movie scenes or news stories can be utilised to show how English is used in everyday communication.

Using such resources also increases learners' confidence when engaging with native speakers since they get comfortable with proper pronunciation, pace, and rhythm.
