Antiellipsis, on the other hand, functions as a stylistic tool that reinforces meaning through repetition and syntactic completeness. The analysis demonstrates that these two phenomena serve complementary functions in shaping the author's individual style and enhancing the pragmatic effectiveness of literary texts. The findings contribute to the broader understanding of stylistic devices in Uzbek literary language and provide insights into the interaction between syntax and artistic expression.

Antielipsis, in contrast, refers to the deliberate preservation or repetition of syntactic elements that might otherwise be omitted, thereby strengthening emphasis and clarity. In modern linguistics, ellipsis is studied from several perspectives, including syntactic, pragmatic, and stylistic approaches. Researchers emphasize that ellipsis contributes to the naturalness of dialogue and reflects the economy principle in language use. In literary discourse, it often mirrors real communication and enhances the emotional dynamics of the text. The works of are particularly rich in expressive linguistic devices. His narrative style reflects the dynamics of everyday speech while maintaining artistic depth and symbolic meaning. Ellipsis and antielipsis frequently appear in his texts, helping to shape character speech, narrative tension, and emotional nuance. Despite the significance of these linguistic phenomena, their functional role in Samandar's works has not been sufficiently explored in linguistic studies. Most previous research has focused on thematic or literary aspects of his writings rather than on their syntactic and stylistic structure. Therefore, the aim of this study is to analyze the functional characteristics of ellipsis and antielipsis in the works of Erkin Samandar. The research seeks to identify their structural patterns, communicative roles, and stylistic effects in literary discourse.

In this example, the subject and auxiliary verb are omitted, yet the meaning remains clear. Such constructions imitate natural conversation and make the dialogue more



realistic.

### **Emotional Ellipsis**

Ellipsis also appears in emotionally intense scenes. Characters experiencing strong emotions often produce fragmented speech. For instance, instead of a complete sentence, a character might say: “Too late... everything... lost.” These incomplete structures convey hesitation, shock, or despair more effectively than grammatically complete sentences.

### **Narrative Ellipsis**

In narrative sections, ellipsis is sometimes used to accelerate the pace of storytelling. By omitting predictable information, the author allows the reader to focus on key events and emotional developments.

### **Antielipsis as Emphasis**

Unlike ellipsis, antielipsis emphasizes completeness and repetition. In many passages, intentionally repeats syntactic elements to reinforce meaning. Example:

“He waited for the answer. He waited in silence. He waited with hope.” The repetition of the subject and verb creates rhythmic intensity and emphasizes the character’s emotional state.

### **Stylistic Balance**

The study reveals that ellipsis and antielipsis often appear together within the same narrative context. Ellipsis shortens and intensifies speech, while antielipsis expands and highlights key ideas.

This stylistic balance contributes significantly to the unique narrative voice found in Samandar’s works.

The coexistence of these two phenomena illustrates the flexibility of literary language. While ellipsis promotes brevity and subtlety, antielipsis introduces emphasis and rhythmic balance. Another important observation concerns the pragmatic function of ellipsis. In Samandar's texts, elliptical structures often signal emotional tension, hesitation, or psychological conflict. Such structures reflect the inner state of characters and contribute to the dramatic quality of the narrative. From a stylistic perspective, the strategic use of ellipsis and antielipsis demonstrates the author's mastery of syntactic variation.
